I'm very excited that our digital magazines have moved to a new platform. It's a true upgrade in the reading experience, and for users of Libby/Overdrive a smooth transition. I spent the weekend reading *Newsweek*, *The Smithsonian*, as well as a host of food magazines.

In addition to our Overdrive collection, one of my new Ferguson Library favorites is PressReader. You can find the dailies from throughout the country as well as numerous popular magazines. PressReader has more than 6,000 newspapers and magazines from around the world in 60-plus languages (you can even find the Italian edition of *Vogue*). Both of these resources are great for recreational browsing and reading. If you are interested in research, we have a host of other resources depending on the topic. For a general search, I love Academic Search Premier. I can type in a subject or author and find a lot of useful information. Whether it is casual reading or research, The Ferguson Library has a digital magazine for you.

### South End Branch Undergoing Renovation

The Ferguson Library's South End Branch will be closed for several weeks while the branch gets a much-needed renovation. We're putting in a new, modern information desk and updating the carpet and furniture throughout to make the space more functional. The South End Branch opened in 1970, and was last updated in the mid-1990s. The project is generously funded by grants from the Stamford Rotary Club, First County Bank Foundation, CT Next, and general support from the community.

The Bookmobile will be on site Monday through Thursday in the parking lot of the Lathon Wider Community Center to provide library service while the branch is closed. We expect to reopen in April with a new, updated facility.
